The Spirit of Elections

- The goal of the Elections' team is to facilitate an accountable, fair and FUN election for all Laurier students
- We aim to uphold the integrity of Wilfrid Laurier University and our Students' Union
- We encourage candidates to be creative and to engage the student body
- We expect the candidates and their campaign teams to abide by university policies and election policies alike
- Do NOT try to demerit another candidate out of the race

Remember, the goal is to put your best self out there; not to tear others down



Open Forum

- Open Forum is a chance for students to ask you questions about why you would be best for the position
- It is not a debate, rather an expression of your opinion on issues that affect students
- Board of Directors you will be split up into randomized groups so that students have a better opportunity to get to know you

Radio Laurier Interviews

Policy 1: Student Elections Code of Conduct

- Outlines what is acceptable conduct by Candidates and their teams during the election period
- If you do not follow the Code of Conduct you and your team are subject to demerits
- One must not harass, aggressively campaign towards students
- One must refrain from using profanity, slander, derogatory statements or disrespecting the electoral process.
- Respect the rules of all Students Union business operations including but not limited to the Turret, Wilfs, Brantford Williams



Policy 2: Campaigning

Active Campaigning

Any direct and immediate act where a vote is solicited through direct engagement with a member of the WLU Students' Union

Passive Campaigning

- Wearing campaign shirts, wearing buttons
- Campaign Period
 - 30 minutes after ACM or otherwise noted by CRO, until 30 minutes before opening of polls
- Absolutely no in-person campaigning



Policy 2: Reimbursements

- Approval of campaign items of all kinds (including posters) must be done by CRO or warrants a demerit
- Directors: \$100
- Senators/Governors: \$30
- Referendum Party Chair: \$300
- Presidents: \$500
- Must submit receipts by January 24th 12 noon to CRO
- Gifts in Kind Will count towards your reimbursements



Policy 3: Promotional Materials

- All materials bearing the candidates' name, likeness, image or brand MUST be approved by the CRO (Karneet)
 - Please send a digital copy of all promotional media to Karneet
 - If material have been purchased and fail to be approved, they will not be reimbursed
- Every candidate must use the #LaurierVotes logo
- Be sure to tag the @lauriervotes account in your posts (main and story)
- Use the hashtag #LaurierVotes2022 in your description, if you'd like
- All Board of Governors and Senate candidates must use the WLU logo as well.
 - Elections policy 14.1.2.4



Policy 3: Cont'd

Social Media Policy

- Facebook
 - Personal Facebook pages or Fan pages are allowed so long as they have been approved by the CRO
 - Posting in groups such as Accepted Classes or Residence Floor groups is NOT tolerated and you will receive demerit points
- Official Mailing Groups
 - Candidates cannot send out emails to any groups, similar to posting in Facebook groups
- Please respect students' wishes if they do not want to be contacted or removed from contact lists (Snapchat, etc.)



Policy 4: Appeals

- Minor Offences (1): promotional material violations
- Moderate Offences (3): illegal campaigning, using unapproved materials, repetition of minor offences, exceeding spending limits by 10%
- Major Offences (5): slander, libel, excessive spending over 10%, abuse of candidate/ referendum chair's position, use of official mailing lists
- Not an extensive list



Policy 4: Cont'd

Consequences

- 7 demerits (Referendum Chair) = new chair is selected
- 10 demerits (Referendum Chair) = Sacrifice reimbursements
- 7 demerits = automatically sacrifices 50% of reimbursements
- 10 demerits = disqualification, (automatically subject to appeal)
- Discretion based:
 - Karneet will decide on a case by case basis
 - At no point will a demerit be awarded due to an error in interpretation or dereliction of duties of an Elections Team Official



Appeals

- If you are awarded a demerit, you have an opportunity to appeal your demerit if you do not think you deserve it
- The appeals committee is comprised of Karneet, Andrew, 2 Directors and 2 students at large (one from each campus)
- Appeals will be handled in a timely manner as best as possible within 24 hours from the time the appeal was received



Appeals

- A candidate or referendum chair must provide written notice in hard or electronic copy to the Chair of the Board, Chief Governance Officer of any appeal of demerit awarded by the CRO or DRO by 11:59pm the following business day.
- Email Andrew, (<u>suboardchair@wlu.ca</u>) with a reason for why you have a case for why you should not have been awarded a demerit
- Any disqualifications will be prompted to an automatic appeal process
- Any decision made by the Appeals Committee shall be final and shall be communicated to the candidate/Referendum chair immediately following the decision



Sample Demerit Notification

January 17, 2022 12:50pm

Candidate,

You have received three (3) demerits for campaigning with unapproved materials. You have been found to be using a Facebook Fan page (or posting unapproved posters or using unapproved poster boards) which have not been approved by the CRO. Sample Appeal

Appeal

Notes on Appeal

- Section 15. 2 states that ALL materials must be preapproved by the CRO's Office prior to its release
- Ignorance is not an acceptable grounds for appeal as such this appeal would be denied and 3 demerit points would be given to this candidate



Non-Campaign Team Members

- For students who are NOT members of any campaign team, they still must follow the Student Code of Conduct
 - Harassment (based on the Ontario Human Rights Code)
 - Obstruction or disruption of elections events
 - Theft, damage and destruction of property
 - Defamation (libel or slander)
- Will be dealt with through the Dean of Students Office for review by the Student Conduct Administrator



Voting Systems

There are two voting systems for elected positions

- Multiple candidates, one winner: Optional Instant Runoff Voting (OIRV or IRV)
 - Ex. President
- Multiple candidates, multiple winners: Single Transferable Vote (STV)
 - Ex. Board of Directors, Board of Governors, Waterloo Senate
- There is one voting system for Referenda Questions
 First Past the Post (FPTP)



O-IRV Instant Runoff

Ranked Ballot

- □ Can rank 1st choice, 1st and 2nd choices, 1st, 2nd, 3rd choices, etc.
 - Cannot rank 1st choice and last choice, ignoring the middle
 - Cannot skip 1st choice if ranking candidates
- Each voter gets 1 vote- will never be split
- Not a points system- only 1st priority counts at first
- To win, a candidate must get at least 50.01% of the vote
- If no candidate has >50%, the lowest candidate is dropped and their votes reassigned to the next highest applicable priority
- Repeat as necessary



STV

Ranked ballot

- □ Can rank 1st choice, 1st and 2nd choices, 1st, 2nd, 3rd choices, etc.
 - Cannot rank 1st choice and last choice, ignoring the middle
 - Cannot skip 1st choice if ranking candidates
- Each voter gets 1 vote will probably be split
- Not a points system only 1st priority counts at first
- To win, the candidate must reach the droop quota
 - Droop quota=
 - 1 + (# of Voters)/ (# of seats +1)
